## (33) Nazareth's Second Rejection of Christ (Mt. 13:53-58; Mk. 6:1-6)

- 1. Jesus came to his hometown ( $\pi\alpha\tau p'i\varsigma$  patris  $^{\#3968}_{4x}$ ) for the second recorded time since His ministry began.
  - a. See [GM2: Rejected at Nazareth] for the first episode in Jesus' hometown.
  - b. The last time He made them so angry they tried to kill Him (Luke 4:16-30).
- 2. Jesus teaching ministry caused astonishment.  $\vec{\epsilon}\kappa\pi\lambda\dot{\eta}\sigma\sigma\omega$  ekplēssō  $^{\#1605}_{13x}$ .
  - a. Teaching with authority produced repeated astonishment (Matt. 7:28; 22:33; Mk. 1:22; 11:18; Lk. 4:32; Acts 13:12 cf. Mpol 7:3).
  - b. Wisdom (ἡ σοφία sophia #4678<sub>51x</sub>).
  - c. Powers (αἱ δυνάμεις dunameis #1411<sub>119x</sub>).
- 3. His fellow Nazarenes could not overcome their subjectivity (Mt. 13:55-57; Mk. 6:3-4).
  - a. The carpenter's son (Matt. 13:55) the carpenter (Mk. 6:3).
  - b. Mother Mary and four brothers by name.
  - c. Sisters (plural) "all with us" (Matt. 13:56) "here with us" (Mark 6:3).
- 4. The outcome of their subjectivity was an active unbelief.
  - a. They took offense (Matt. 13:57; Mk. 6:3). Imperf.pass. σκανδαλίζω skandalizō #4624 29x: cause to stumble, be led into sin. See Rom. 9:33; 1st Pet. 2:8 and Rom. 14:13,21; 1st Cor. 8:9,13 for "stumbling block" principles.
  - b. He performed not many miracles because of their unbelief (Mt. 13:58; Mk. 6:5-6). ἀπιστία apistia #570<sub>11x</sub>. See also ἀπιστέω apisteō #569<sub>8x</sub> & ἄπιστος apistos #571<sub>23x</sub>. It is important to note that the text says both He "did not" (Matt. 13:58) and that He "could not" (Mark 6:5).
